**RELIGIOUS FREEDOM DAY**  
**Sunday, January 10, 2010**

On Sunday, January 10, 2010 Rappahannock Assembly will host a parade and ceremony in Fredericksburg, VA commemorating the 233<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom. The statute, drafted by Thomas Jefferson in 1777 in Fredericksburg, was later used as a model by President James Madison in drafting the Bill of Rights and represents a document that had a unique impact on our Nation that continues to this day. This event acknowledges the belief that each individual has the right to practice his or her chosen faith, a right second only to the right to life itself.

The parade, about one mile in length, will depart the Fredericksburg train station at 1:30 PM, proceed through downtown Fredericksburg to the Religious Freedom Monument located on Washington Ave. where the ceremony will begin at 2:00 PM, highlighted by the keynote address to be delivered by Virginia State Del. Robert D. Orrock Sr. The ceremony will culminate with the laying of a wreath at the monument. A reception at the University of Mary Washington Catholic Student Center will follow.



**All Assemblies in the Virginia District are invited to participate in this unique event. Dress for the event is full Color Corps regalia. **Driving Directions:** To reach the railroad station in downtown Fredericksburg, take Route 3 East (exit 130 East (Route 3) off I-95. After approximately 1 mile you will pass under Route 1 and come to a stoplight. Turn left at the stoplight and follow Route 3 business (William Street) into the downtown area. Turn right on Princess Ann Street to get to the Train Station.
